Jose Antonio Vargas is a journalist, filmmaker, and immigration rights activist. Born in the Philippines and raised in Mountain View (and a student of Jill Denny), he was part of The Washington Post team that won the Pulitzer Prize for Breaking News Reporting in 2008 for coverage of the Virginia Tech shooting online and in print. **Vargas is the founder of Define American, a nonprofit organization intended to open up dialogue about the criteria people use to determine who is an American.** Dinner is Chicken Taco Bar, Caesar Salad and dessert catered from Una Mas. On Thursday, Nov. 15th, Bethel Lutheran will host a special event featuring Rev. Dr. Mitri Raheb, **presenting “Jerusalem: What Makes for Peace?”**, a timely exploration of Jerusalem as key to peace in the Middle East.

Mitri Raheb is a Palestinian Christian, the pastor of the Evangelical Lutheran Christmas Church in Bethlehem (a member church of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land, or ELCJHL), and the founder and president of the Diyar Consortium, a group of Lutheran-based, ecumenically-oriented institutions serving the Bethlehem area. He is an author, Lutheran theologian, President of Bright Stars of Bethlehem, social entrepreneur, Dar al-Kalima University President, husband and father.

CARE PACKAGES FOR THE HOMELESS EVENT ON FRI., NOV. 30TH

The 4th annual Care Packages for the Homeless event is taking place on Friday, November 30, 2018, hosted by the Youth Board. Our goal is to assemble 150 packages. If you would like to donate items, place them in the collection box located in the Narthex.

All items should be NEW: socks, knit gloves, toothbrushes, travel size toothpaste, Band-Aids, individually wrapped alcohol wipes, tissue packets, lip balm, travel size shampoo and conditioner, travel size bar soap or shower gel, individually packaged beef jerky and trail mix.

Most of these items may be found at Target, Walmart and Amazon.com. Try contacting your dentist/orthodontist for toothbrush and toothpaste donations, and local hotels for soap, shampoo and conditioner donations. Costco usually carries socks, Band-Aids, and individually packaged beef jerky and trail mix.

If you would like to make a monetary donation, place it in the offering plate on Sunday morning – put cash in an envelope labeled “Homeless care packages”, or write a check out to “St. Luke” with “Homeless care packages” on the memo line. ADULT LEARNING CLASS – OLD TESTAMENT STUDY

We cannot know Jesus without knowing his story. Today the debate over who Jesus is rages on. Has the Bible bound Christians to a narrow and mistaken notion of Jesus? Should we listen to other gospels and other sayings of Jesus that enlarge and correct a mistaken story? To answer these questions, we need to know what story Jesus claimed for himself. In his new book "Knowing Jesus through the Old Testament", Christopher Wright traces the life of Christ as it is illuminated by the Old Testament. And he describes God's design for Israel as it is fulfilled in the story of Jesus.

TUBFRIM NEEDS YOUR USED STAMPS


DEADLINES
