SUNDAY MORNING ADULT BIBLE STUDY – THE CASE FOR CHRIST

The Case for Christ is both a movie and a book by Lee Strobel, an award-winning legal journalist for the Chicago Tribune. His wife’s becoming a Christian set this atheist on a journey to prove Christianity wrong, so that he could set his wife straight. For two years he researched and interviewed a number of highly respected Christian scholars. In the end he says he finally came to realize it would take more faith to disbelieve the tenets of Christianity than to believe and at that point, he did come to faith in Christ. The book and movie tell the story of his journey to faith.

The St Luke adult Bible study program centered around this book starts today with the showing of the 2017 movie *The Case for Christ* (in two parts, continuing next Sunday, 11/12) in the sanctuary, followed by a four-week study that explores elements of Lee Strobel’s faith journey and contains these topics:

1. Investigating the Case for Christ
2. Exploring the Evidence for Christ
3. Embracing the Truth of Christ
4. Explaining the Good News of Christ

Each week the study starts with a clip from the movie and then uses a written guide to lead the class through various discussion questions related to the weekly topic to help us to better understand and be able to defend our faith.

That study will meet in the Narthex and will be led by Gloria Fairchild. Hope to see you there for a fun and spirit-filled dialogue!
